

In Ecuador, for the year 2020, only 9.13% of the total number of students enrolled in a university belonged to an ethnic group including Afro-descendants and indigenous people.







- Fostering equitable partnerships in research, where indigenous and local partners are part of the core research team
- Collect ethnic data about authors publishing articles in indexed journals: Situational
  diagnosis of the percentage of publications coming from indigenous peoples
  and nationalities and for the orientation of public policies that guarantee the
  right to publish in ancestral languages in high impact journals
- Ensure knowledge guardians are duly recognized in publications and that communities that jointly maintain traditional knowledge are duly acknowledged
- Support the call for double blinded peer review mechanisms where the identity of the author is not known to the reviewer to ensure there is no unconscious bias towards authors from recognized, northern universities so that this peer review system becomes more widely used



# RESEARCH & KNOWLEDGE CONTEXT



- First Nations, Inuit and Métis communities have unique histories, cultures and traditions
- Share core values such as reciprocity give something back
- Basis for relationships that can benefit both Indigenous and research communities.
- Research has been defined and carried out primarily by non-Indigenous researchers.
- Approaches used have not generally reflected Indigenous world views, and not necessarily benefited Indigenous peoples or communities.
- Apprehension & mistrust




Research should be relevant to community needs and priorities. The research should benefit the participating community (e.g., training, local hiring, recognition of contributors, return of results), as well as extend the boundaries of knowledge.

### **Application**

A research project should be relevant to community priorities and have the potential to produce valued outcomes from the perspective of the community and its members

## Two-Eyed Seeing Approach



Two-Eyed Seeing is the merging of two 'ways of knowing' – Indigenous and Western – to view and overcome challenges and barriers. This approach takes the best from both worldviews, acknowledging that neither approach is superior. (Established by Elders Albert & Murdena Marshall)




