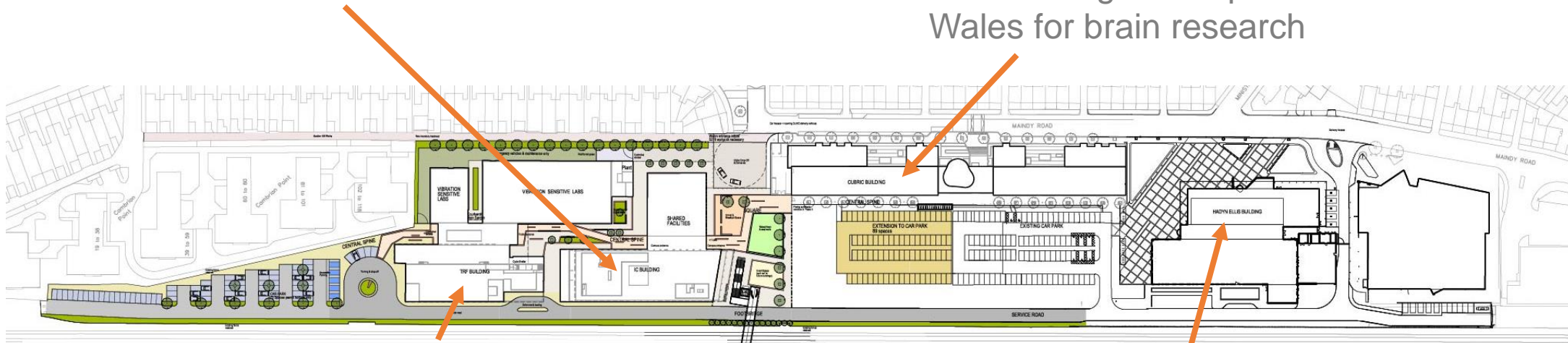

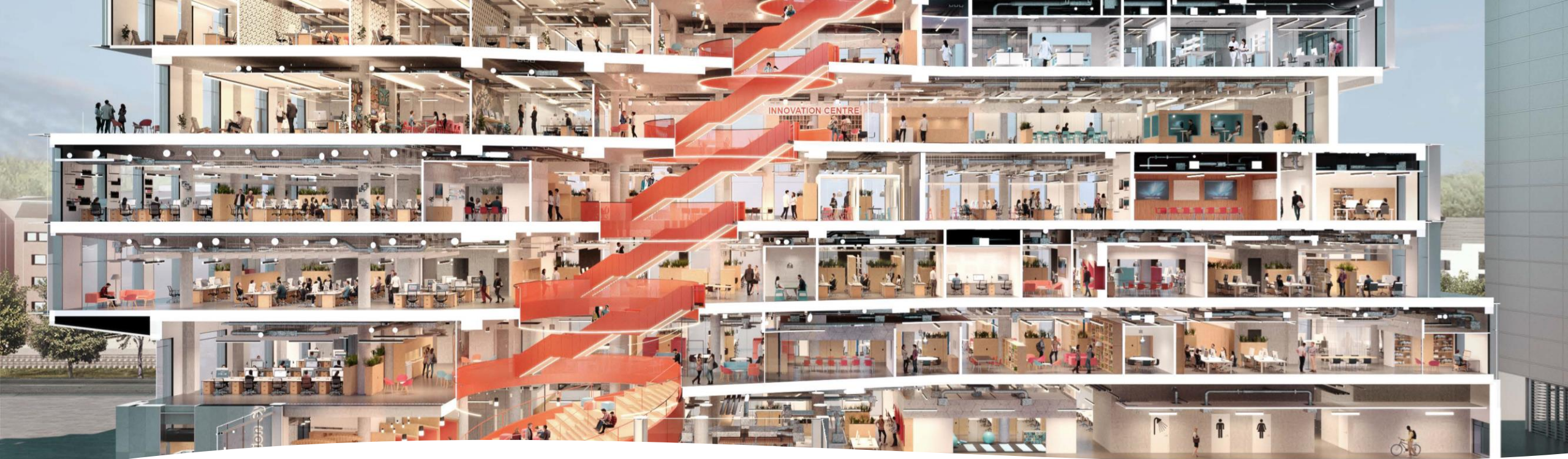

Grow our international reputation in research excellence

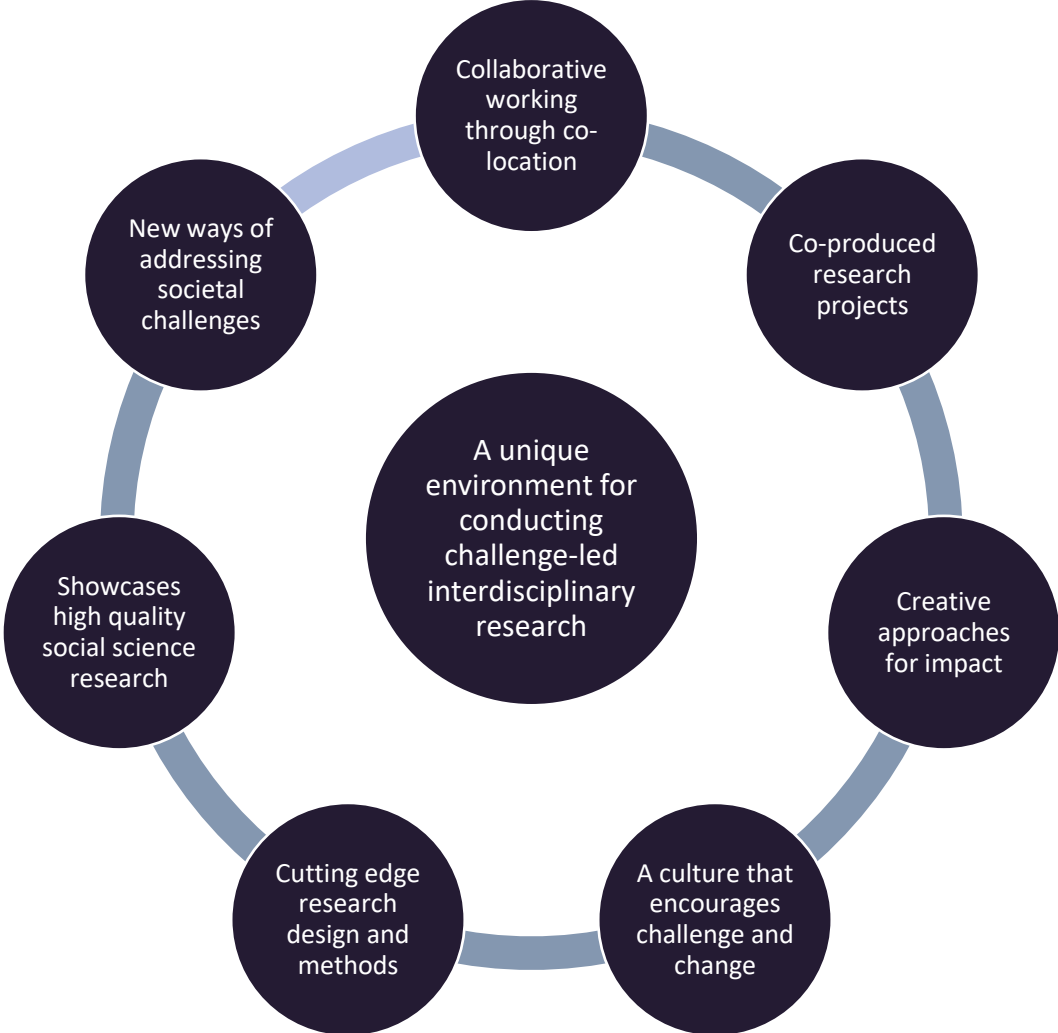

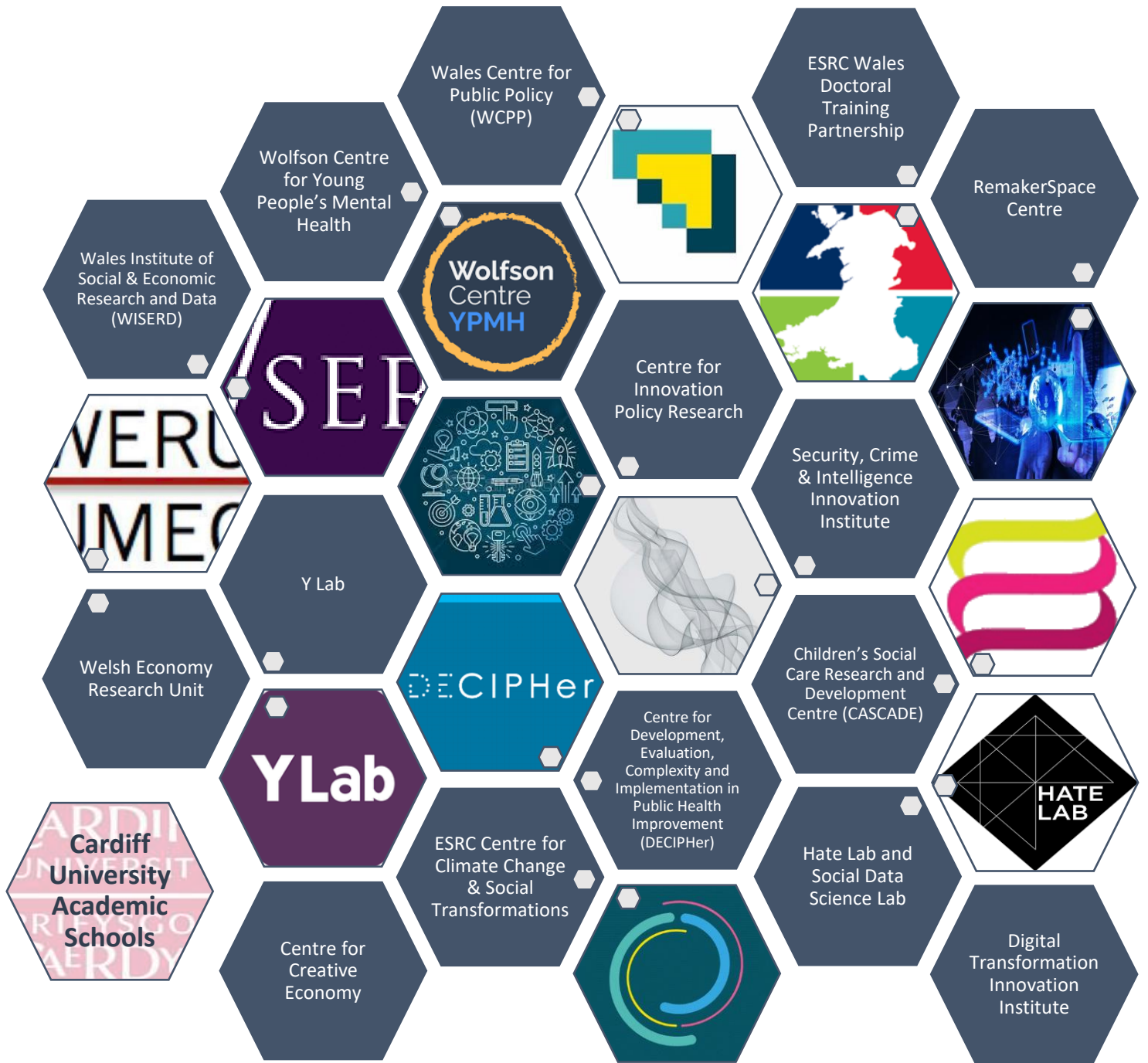

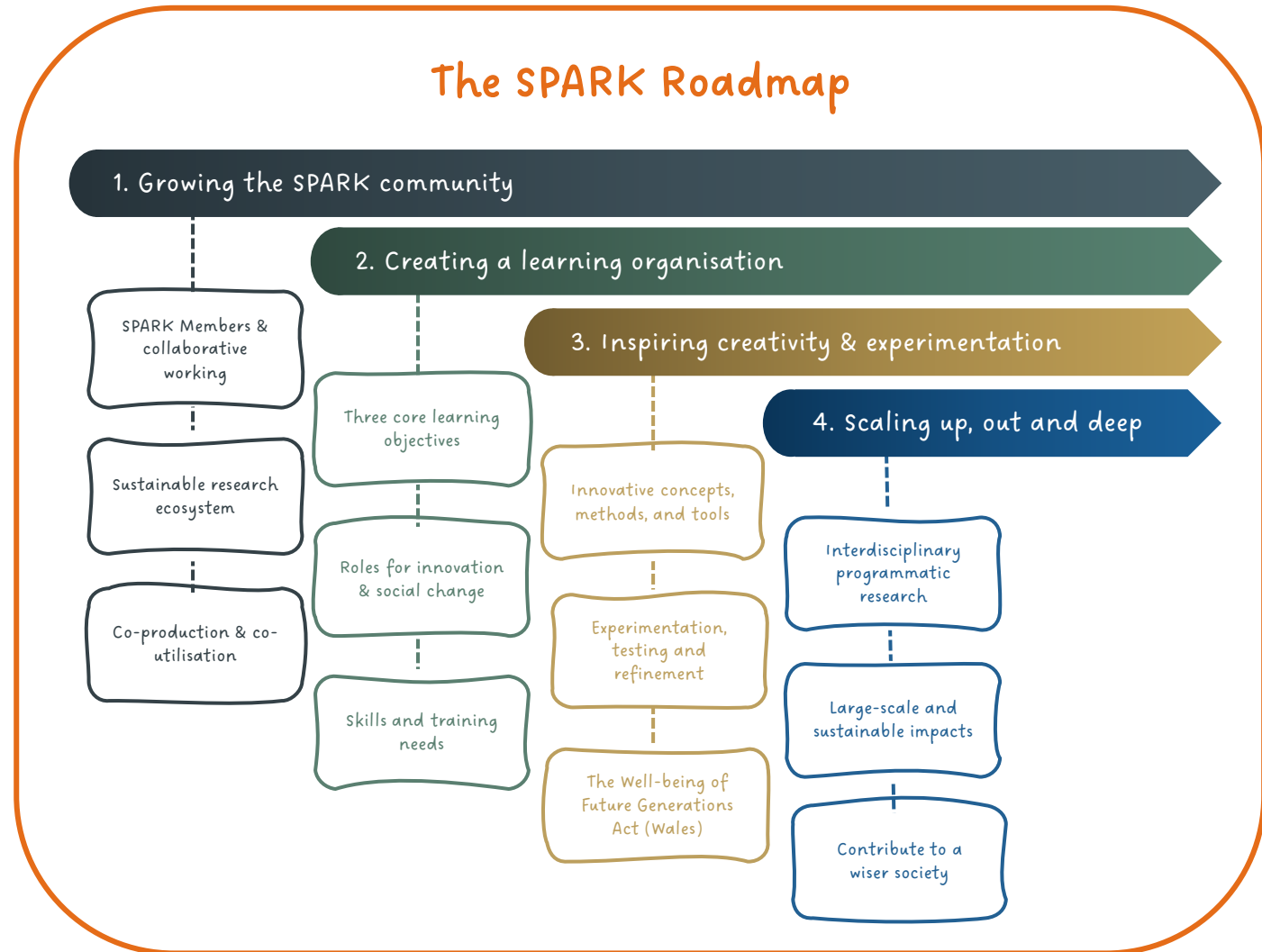
The SPARK Roadmap

Although the social sciences have successfully created new knowledge and understanding they have been much less effective in learning how new knowledge might be used and applied

increasing recognition that to effectively address these challenges in society, social science research needs to change

SPARK aims to do this in two main ways:

1. by delivering a step-change in our social science research
 - encouraging and developing innovative methodological, theoretical and social practices in SPARK through the co-production of research with our partners
2. by becoming a 'just anchor' for its immediate community
 - applying the learning and outputs from SPARK within the Cardiff Capital Region through the co-utilisation of research with our local communities
