





- □ 15 researchers, grants: Velux Foundation, Danish Council for Independent Research, European Commission, Danish Ministry of Science etc.














# The Impact Agenda of SSH




- Universities and research units are expected to establish a track record for impact (for careers, funding, accountability etc.)
- Broader societal impact has becomes an obligatory component of research evaluation (EU, SIAMPI, IMPACT-EVT, REF, NSF, SEP etc.)
- □ 'Grand challenges' H2020, 'Societal Missions/Moonshots' for FP9
- □ Considerable dissatisfaction with the way science relates to economy & society (post-truth, post-trust, AI, biotech, crisis of humanities)
- □ "Failure" of translation mainly related to the science system and scientists (many studies, e.g. ESRC 2009, Young 2008)







# The EU referendum debate in the UK Mapping polarization on social media


Semantic network analysis of 13,310 co-occurring hashtags on Instagram related to the UK's EU referendum debate #brexit
